The West Bottoms’ Rumely event space has been remodeled with a new impressive entrance and accommodations that can host weddings or wedding parties. This weekend, a bride and groom decided to forego their interior space wedding for the covered exterior space under the iconic 12th Street Bridge, adjacent to the Rumely. They’ll use the Rumely to ready for their wedding. Rather than the traditional wedding fare, they’ll have food trucks offering food to guests for the momentous occasion.

“We’ve always been an area that can flex to meet the occasion,” said Amber Arnett-Bequeaith, West Bottoms district spokesperson also known as the Queen of the West Bottoms. “We have lots of space in the Bottoms – which works in favor of shopping and allowing social distance, as well as spacious and creative wedding venues. This busy time for weddings is also a chance for us to reflect on the renewal of love and getting back to business.”

About the West Bottoms Historic Entertainment District:

The West Bottoms Historic Entertainment District, located just off the 12th Street Bridge, has 22 warehouses in a thirteen-block area with approximately 600 vendors and more than 25 stores and restaurants. Many of the large, multi-story buildings have histories starting over 120 years ago. They have now repurposed this vast space to earn the title of the largest, year-round, indoor vintage and entertainment district. collectors and consumers seeking stylish décor and gift options with history and patina that cannot be duplicated.
